The experience culminated in 2006 with his acclaimed business documentary on the company, "Why Wal-Mart Works & Why That Makes Some People Crazy," which he produced and directed. The film premiered inside the U.S. Capitol Building in Washington, DC and received global attention. Ron spent a full year deep inside Wal-Mart gaining access to cutting-edge logistics and IT systems. He is a widely recognized expert on Wal-Mart and their business practices.

Because of his expertise and insight, Ron was featured on CNN, CNBC, MSNBC, ABC's World News Tonight and Good Morning America. He has been on nearly 100 talk radio shows, including frequent appearances on the BBC. Print coverage includes features in the *New York Times*, *Washington Post*, *USA Today*, *LA Times* and over 300 other newspapers worldwide.

Ron is a frequent keynote speaker whose presentations include a variety of business topics, notably regarding economic forecasts, Wal-Mart and its effect on healthcare, banking and retail and innovations in business technology and finance.
